



Cookies

When you visit our web sites our web server sends a cookie to your computer. Cookies are small pieces of information which are issued to your computer when you visit a web site and which store and sometimes track information about your use of the site. Some of the cookies we use last only for the duration of your web session and expire when you close your browser. Other cookies are used to remember you when you return to our web site(s) and will last longer.

We use cookies to:

- authenticate your access and/or route traffic to various areas of our web sites
- remember that you have visited us before. This means we are able to identify the number of unique visitors we receive, and implement enough capacity for the number of users we get
- customise elements of the promotional layout and/or content of the pages of our web sites
- collect statistical information about how you use our web site(s) so that we can improve the site and learn which parts of the web site are most popular to visitors
- gather information about the pages on the web site that you visit, so as to place you in an “interest segment”. This information is only linked to an anonymous cookie ID and does not include any information which could be traced back to a particular person, such as the name, address or credit card number. This information is then used to place targeted interest-based advertisements from Workday or through third party web site publishers which it is believed will be relevant to your interests. Some of the cookies used by our website are set by us, and some are set by third parties who are delivering services on our behalf.

Most web browsers automatically accept cookies but, if you prefer, you may change your browser settings to prevent that or to notify you each time a cookie is set. Please note however, that by blocking or deleting cookies used on a Workday web site you may not be able to take full advantage of the site.

In addition to cookies, tracking gifs or web beacons may be used by us or by third parties in respect of your use of our web sites. These are small image files within the content of our sites or the body of our newsletters or advertising through which we or our service providers can recognise a cookie on your web browser which, in turn, enables us to understand which parts of our web sites are visited, whether particular content is of interest, and which advertisements are most effective.

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
